Important Events The 1605 The Gunpowder Plot was a plot to kill Gunpowder King James I and his government by blowing up the Houses of Parliament. Plot The 1902 Captain Robert Scott went on an expedition to the Antarctic. It was the Discovery of the first time that humans had been Antarctic there! **Bonfire** King James I ordered that people **Present** should celebrate his survival on the Night day 5th November. To this day, people still light bonfires and burn 'guys' (puppets made of straw, named after Guy Fawkes) to celebrate.
