

GGA – Writing (Stories with characterisation) for Year Two

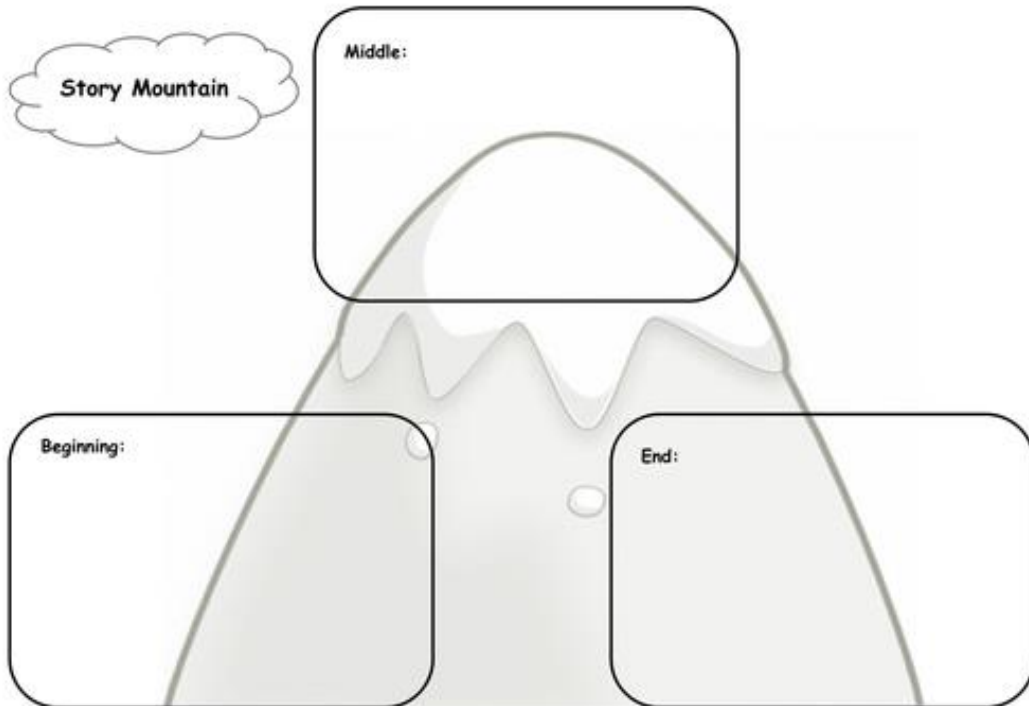
Success Criteria

Why are we learning this?

Why is it important?

Reading stories helps us to develop our imagination and, most of all, is fun!

Key definitions

Appearance	What someone looks like.
Personality	What someone is like inside e.g. kind, evil, funny
Role	Their job in the story.
