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Vocabulary Layers of sound, such as those created by a melody accompanied Texture by a drum beat Percussion instruments which make sounds with a defined pitch, Tuned eg glockenspiel Percussion instruments which make sounds of indefinite pitch, eg Untuned hand drum Music composition, or composition, can refer to an original piece or work of music, either vocal or instrumental, the Compose structure of a musical piece, or to the process of creating or writing a new piece of music.
